



Public Policy-Townhall Forum

Unite Rochester is an initiative spearheaded by the **Democrat and Chronicle.**

While there are several areas of focus, the goal of the Justice Initiative: "to unite Rochester by focusing upon justice in the Rochester community and by identifying barriers to inclusion, equal treatment, fairness and impartiality regardless of race or nationality."



The committee came together asking the critical question, "Is there a lack of unity in our community that is evidenced in the Justice System?"

The Unite Justice Engagement Committee came up with 3 priorities - Educate the Community, Engage the Community and Improve Access to Employment. The second priority took place on November 13, 2014 at 6 PM as a locally televised Community Town Hall. Senator Chuck Schumer was instrumental is getting our guest speaker, Ronald L. Davis, the Director of the Office of Community- Oriented Policing Services, United States Department of Justice.

The Town Hall involved a panel of criminal justice professionals that responded to questions submitted by community members as well as those from the criminal justice field. A luncheon was held for the panelists at the American Association of University Women, which was underwritten by the Monroe County Sheriff's Association.
