
FROM OUR PRESIDENT, GAYNELLE WETHERS

What A Banner Year! GRAB/AAUW celebrates 100 years! The Charitable Trust was launched! COPE (Coalition for Pay Equity) under our Public Policy held a Press Conference addressing Equal Pay, and Women Helping Girls held a girls conference with over 2000 girls at the Blue Cross Arena!

Our branch programs included journey from poverty to a successful journalism career, Women in the Military, Women's Rights, Racism and Disability Rights, and Climate Change. We collaborated with our partners, The League of Women Voters and Roches-

ter NOW, with programs which were well-attended. We were successful with several grants for Women Helping Girls. We received \$1000 from the Palma Foundation and \$10,000 from the Daisy Marquis Jones Foundation. We also received a grant from COPE for Public Policy and \$800 from the Walmart Foundation. The NY Council for the Humanities grants GRAB/AAUW \$200 for the community conversation program when ten people attend the event.

AAUW NYS - SAVE THE DATES


Missed the AAUW-New York State convention in April 2016?

AAUW Statement on New Overtime Compensation Rule




May 18, 2016 AAUW and our 170,000 members and supporters across the country applaud the U.S. Department of Labor for issuing its final rule on overtime compensation protections, which reflects the current economic realities facing women and their families nationwide. AAUW strongly advocated for the new rule because it provides long awaited and improved overtime protections for millions of salaried workers, more than half of whom are women, and it is a critical part of addressing the gender pay gap.

Federal overtime policies haven't kept up with the times. In 1975, more than 60 percent of employees

qualified for overtime pay based on their salaries, whereas today that figure is just 7 percent. The new rule will derail an all-too-common practice: Research shows that employers routinely "promote" previously nonexempt workers (those eligible to earn overtime pay) to salaried, low-level managerial positions that demand more than 40 hours of work each week without overtime pay. AAUW believes that the strengthened rule will help address that problematic practice, which essentially denies millions of workers reasonable overtime pay. By raising the overtime salary threshold, the Department of Labor has taken a commonsense step toward achieving pay equity and economic security for millions of working families.
