Second-hand clothing is a profitable market in many countries around the world. Bras are unusually sought-after items. Re-selling them provides opportunities for these trafficked women to work with other women. Most of them were sold into prostitution as children, some as young as 8-10 years old. Because their lives were stolen from them, they missed out on going to school and getting educations. Re-selling bras allows the girls to work as much or as little as their school schedule permits.
